2021 Short-Term Program Goals

Goal 1. Start a public outreach program

Milestones 1 Speak to stakeholders (i.e. Community Advisory Comity, Municipalities, consumers, career centers, Employers, KMM Keep Middlesex Moving, workforce investment board and workshops) regarding their current services and their transportation needs.

Milestones 2 Review monetary needs for services requested such as vehicles, staffing, maintenance and schedules.

Milestones 2 Forecast ridership and passenger watershed in support of Middlesex County resident's needs.
