The Middlesex County Utilities Authority (MCUA) staff has reviewed your letter received July 17, 2002 requesting the MCUA approval to allow the wastewater generated from the proposed building on the referenced parcel of land to be conveyed to the Western Monmouth Utilities Authority (WMUA) for treatment. The referenced parcel of land is within the service area of the MCUA as designated by the Lower Raritan-Middlesex County Wastewater Management Plan dated September 7, 2000. Therefore, final approval for the conveyance of wastewater flow to the WMUA must be received from the County of Middlesex that is the designated Water Quality Management Planning and Wastewater Management Planning Agency.

The MCUA staff has confirmed with Mr. Michael Rodgers, Executive Director of the Monroe Township Municipal Utilities Authority (MTMUA), that the nearest wastewater collection system owned and operated by the MTMUA is approximately three (3) miles from the referenced property and there are no present plans to extend the wastewater collection system to the area. Therefore, the MCUA has no objection to the wastewater to be generated from the proposed development on the referenced parcel of land being conveyed to the WMUA for treatment based on the following stipulation:

- If in the future the MTMUA wastewater collection system is extended to within 500 feet of the referenced parcel of land, the wastewater collection system servicing any development on the parcel land that is connected to the WMUA shall be terminated and connected to the MTMUA wastewater collection system.


The MCUA approval is contingent upon written concurrence to the above stipulation from the property owner, MTMUA and WMUA.



RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the construction boom in the M.C.U.A. Service Area has greatly increased the frequency of such requests;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Middlesex County Utilities Authority that the Executive Director be and is hereby authorized to process such applications in the best interests of the M.C.U.A. and with due consideration to the interests of the requesting community.

This Resolution shall take effect immediately.




